

7. What is the prophet's family life going to display to the people of Israel?

- 9. How does Hosea respond and what is the outcome? (v.3)



10. What is Hosea and Gomer's first child to be called, and what does his name mean for the life of Israel?



NIV **Hosea 2:19-20** I will betroth you to me forever; I will betroth you in righteousness and justice, in love and compassion. ²⁰ I will betroth you in faithfulness, and you will acknowledge the LORD.

READ HOSEA 3:1-5

9. How does Hosea's own marriage mimic what is going on with God and

10. What does Hosea do in order to get his wife to come home?



11. What will reconciliation look like for Israel (vv.4-5)?

12. In what ways have we turned our backs on God and been party to Spiritual prostitution. What are some of the things we have bought into over the years, thinking that they will be the gateway to the good life?

13. How has God pursued us and treated us better than we deserved? (See e.g. Ephesians 2:1-9)



NIV Hosea 3:5 Afterward the Israelites will return and seek the Lord their God and David their king. They will come trembling to the Lord and to his blessings in the last days.



14. How should we respond to God?

What is the closest thing to 'Eternal Judgment' that our modern society believes in? How might we change their point of view?



NIV Hosea 4:1 Hear the word of the LORD, you Israelites, because the LORD has a charge to bring against you who live in the land: "There is no faithfulness, no love, no acknowledgment of God in the land.



All people and all of Creation have been caught up in the sin of mankind (4:3). Judgment comes upon us all, unless we acknowledge God and our need for him.



READ HOSEA 4:1-2

- 1. How would you describe the behaviour of the Israelites?
- 2. What has the wicked behaviour of Israel caused (v.3)?

READ HOSEA 4:4-8

- 3. Why are they stumbling and why are they being 'destroyed'?
- 4. What is the 'exchange' Hosea talks about in verse 7, and where else have you heard this in scripture?



- 5. What does it mean for God to reject them as his priests (c.f. Exodus 19:6)?
- 6. How much do we draw upon God's wisdom contained in his word, and how much do we rely on the ways of the world? How might we avoid being caught up in worldly ways?



READ HOSEA 4:9-14



- 7. What does the first half of v.9 mean and what does it tell us about the importance of good leadership amongst God's people?
- 8. Who will be punished for Israel's behaviour? (v.9)

Read Romans 1:18-25

How does Paul describe the state of the human heart?

What hope do we have if we continue to rely on ourselves in this life and not on God?

What do we need?



9. When might we be tempted to conduct worship on our own terms and not on God's?

READ HOSEA 4:15-19



10. What is the distinction here between Israel and Judah? (Where are Gilgal and Beth Aven?)

- 11. What are Judah being 'counselled' to do and why might this be the case?
- 12. How can the possibly rectify the situation in 4:1?
- 13. How can we avoid the same pitfalls given the Apostle Paul's read on the human situation in Romans 3:9-20? (Hint: see vv.21-22!)

Hosea 5-6

Our Merciful God



What are some common situations where people ask for mercy?



NIV Hosea 6:6 For I desire mercy, not sacrifice, and acknowledgment of God rather than burnt offerings.



God wants us to be merciful and compassionate to each other rather than self-centred and treacherous. We are called to acknowledge our sin and return to the Lord.



READ HOSEA 5:1-6

- 1. How many times in verse 1 are Israel called to take heed of God's words of prophecy? What does this tell you about the importance of these words?
- 2. What is the image in verse 2, and what does this mean if they are not at war at that point in time?
- 3. Looking at verse 4 how have their actions determined their future, and why are they unable to change?

Read Jeremiah 31:31-33

What will be the difference between the Old Covenant and the New Covenant that God will make with the people?

What change in 'status' can we expect in the New Covenant? (see end of v.33)



READ HOSEA 5:7-15

- 4. What kind of things are going to happen to Israel and Judah because of their wickedness?
- 5. Where did Ephraim turn for help (v.13) and why was this fruitless?
- 6. What action will see them return to the Lord, and what will their return look like?



READ HOSEA 6:1-3

7. How does the tone change in these 3 verses, and what is the call?



- 8. How sure is Hosea that the Lord will respond?
- 9. What is different here compared to 5:6—what has changed?



10. How do these verses speak to us?

11. What is God's desire for his people (v.6)? How might this apply to us?



NIV Romans 6:1-2 What shall we say, then? Shall we go on sinning so that grace may increase? 2 By no means! We are those who have died to sin; how can we live in it any longer?



12. What is the shocking image revealed in verses 8-10? What is their bloodshed and injustice doing to the people? What does verse 6 mean in the light of this wickedness in the land? (c.f. Jeremiah 7:1-11)

14. Read Romans 6:1-14. How does Paul describe what the Christian attitude to sin ought to be?

15. How is Jesus the solution to all the evil practices that were taking place in Judah and Israel? What might we learn from this today?

Hosea 7.

Crying Out to God From Your Heart



Have you ever done something embarrassing/ naughty without realising you had an audience?



NIV Hosea 7:13 Woe to them, because they have strayed from me! Destruction to them, because they have rebelled against me! I long to redeem them but they speak about me falsely.



Left to our own devices we all (like sheep) go astray. We each need the Lord God to work in our hearts to draw us back to him!



READ HOSEA 7:1-7

1. What happens whenever God tries to restore Israel to their former glory and heal all their wounds? (What is 'exposed' v.1)

- 2. What have Israel failed to realise (v.2)? Why might this also be a good thing for us to remember?
- 3. What are the kings and princes delighted with? What is going on here so that by the end of verse 7 the kings have fallen and the rulers are 'devoured'?

Read 2Peter 1:3-11

How do we 'escape' the corruption of the world according to Peter? [What has Jesus given us?]

What are we to 'make every effort' to do and why? (vv.5-9)

What do we stand to receive if we do the things Peter recommends?



4. What is the sad reality identified at the end of verse 7, and how close does this mirror Australian politics today?

READ HOSEA 7:8-12

- 5. What is Ephraim doing that is weakening him without him realising it? (c.f. Deut 11:16-21 & Deut 12:1-7) What is he MEANT to be doing?
- 6. Where have Israel failed to 'return to' or 'search for'? (Where would we 'search' for such things today?)



7. What is the image in verse 11 about and how does it communicate the utter vulnerability of Israel as a nation?



8. What will happen to them if they continue like this—relying on the nations around them?(v.12)

READ HOSEA 7:13-16

9. What words are used to describe Israel's actions in verse 13?



10. What will be God's response to their actions? (v.13)

11. What would God 'prefer' to do in v.13? (How does this compare with Jesus' words in Matthew 23:37-39?)



12. If this is how Israel were treating their God, how would they have been treating his messengers the prophets?

13. What is their response when they don't get what they want from their false gods? (v.14) How would things improve if they 'cried out to God from their heart'?

14. How can we take a stand for the Lord in our times when we see much of the same behaviour today in both society and amongst our leaders?



NIV Matthew 5:11-12 11 "Blessed are you when people insult you, persecute you and falsely say all kinds of evil against you because of me. 12 Rejoice and be glad, because great is your reward in heaven, for in the same way they persecuted the prophets who were before you.



15. How might you be able to encourage a brother or sister in Christ who is currently facing a tough situation in their life?

READ HOSEA 8:1

4. What are Israel 'saying' about their allegiance to God?



- 5. What do their actions 'show' about their allegiance to God? (3 actions in vv.2-4)
- 6. When might we 'say' that Jesus is Lord of our life but instead go and do our own thing? (When are we most at risk of this?)



7. How might we avoid simply paying 'lip-service' to Jesus' Lordship and actually allow him to guide and direct our lives?



8. What are the consequences of 'only saying' we follow Jesus, while basically still doing our own thing? (see Matthew 7:21-22)

READ HOSEA 8:5-7

9. Israel have been tempted to "add" other things to their worship of God. What are they told to 'throw-out' and what is it making them 'incapable of'? What do they risk when doing this/what is their reward?

Read 1John 5:18-21

What kind of world are we living in today & who influences it? (Why is it good for us to remember this?)

What kind of knowledge and understanding will help us withstand the evil one and resist his ways and temptations?

What should be our attitude to idols? (Which idols are you most at risk with?)



10. How long have Israel been tempted to 'add' other things to their worship of God? (See Exodus 32:1-6)


11. What are some of the things that we might be tempted to 'add' to our own worship of God? (What are some of society's idols today?)

MIV Hosea 11:8b-9 My heart is changed within me; all my compassion is aroused. 9 I will not carry out my fierce anger, nor will I devastate Ephraim again. For I am God, and not a man— the Holy One among you. I will not come against their cities.
